



National Diploma Unit D - Application of health and safety and practice

A workplace-based assignment (Unit D) set by NEBOSH and marked externally.

Unit D is assessed by a written assignment of approximately 9,000 words, designed to test knowledge across the syllabus Units A, B and C by assessing application of health and safety theory and practice (Unit D).

The assignment is designed to assess the ability of the candidate to apply the knowledge and understanding gained in the National Diploma course to a real workplace situation. The aim of the assignment is to produce an overall review of the health and safety management system of an organisation and indicate, using a risk assessment, the priorities for the organisations for the future.

Excellent coaching in the 'assignment' technique and detailed structure is provided during our sessions.

- A chance for the candidate to discuss any ideas and any problems

- An agreed "skeleton" layout to fill in the details from the particular workplace
